

Mass Intentions

Whenever a priest celebrates
Mass, he has at least two specific
intentions. The first intention is to
celebrate the Mass according to the
rubrics the Church provided for
how to say the Mass. The second
is to apply the grace of that Mass
toward a specific need or intention.
This second intention, commonly
called "the intention of the Mass,"
are special intentions offered to
God as prayers of intercession and
thanksgiving in and through the
Eucharist.

A Mass Intention may be set for:

- A deceased loved one
- A living person who is sick or suffering
- A living person who is celebrating a birthday, anniversary, or other special moment in their life

A Mass intention may not be requested for:

- An unknown or "private" intention
- A prayer intention that contradicts Catholic moral doctrine

Holy Week April 10—Åpril 16, 2022

Holy Week begins with Palm Sunday or otherwise known as Passion Sunday. On this day, we commemorate Jesus' triumphant entry into Jerusa-

On Monday, this day is referred to as Holy Monday. Jesus cursed the fig tree and the overturned the tables and then threw out the merchants from the temple. He was outraged by the selling and bartering inside of the temple which caused him to say,

"My house shall be called the house of prayer; but ye have made it a den of thieves".

On Tuesday, it is believed that he foretold his own death.

On Wednesday, we refer to this day as Spy Wednesday. This is the remembrance of Judas betrayal of Jesus. Judas asked the High Priests, "What will you give me, and I will deliver him unto you?" He then proceeded to sell Jesus out for a mere 30 pieces of temple was torn from top to bottom. silver.

On Thursday, we commemorate Jesus's Last Supper. We also celebrate the institution of the Eucharist. When Jesus has the last supper he also washed the feet of his Apostles. He told them: "If I then, your Lord and Teacher, have washed your feet, you also ought to wash one another's

feet." For I have given you an example, that you should do as I have done to you. John 13:1-17. Shortly after the Last Supper Jesus he went with three (3) of his disciples to the Garden of Gethsemane to pray. It is here in the garden were he was arrested and taken by the soldiers, high priests and Pharisees.

On Friday, Jesus is taken before Pontius Pilate. He is crucified at Golgotha. Jesus' crucifixion takes place at the third hour (9am) and Jesus' Death is at the ninth hour (3pm). Before he takes his last breathe a darkness begins to cover the land. Jesus cries out, "Eli, Eli, lama sabachthani?" "My God, My God, why have you forsaken Me?" Jesus then took his last breath and said, "Father, into your hands I commit my spirit."

Moments later, an earthquake hit, the earth shook and the temple was demolished. The curtain that covered the

On Saturday, Jesus was taken down from the cross and placed in the tomb. His body was anointed with holy oils and he was covered.

On Sunday, the rock which covered the tomb broke open. Jesus came out of tomb and He was resurrected.

EPISTLE Hebrews9. 11-15

Brethren: Christ being come, a High Priest of the good things to come, by a greater and more perfect tabernacle, not made with hands, that is, not of this creation: neither by the blood of goats or of calves, but by His own blood, entered once into the Holies, having obtained eternal redemption. For if the blood of goats and of oxen and the ashes of an heifer, being sprinkled, sanctify such as are defiled, to the cleansing of the flesh: how much more shall the blood of Christ, who, by the Holy Ghost, offered Himself unspotted unto God, cleanse our conscience from dead works, to serve the living God?
