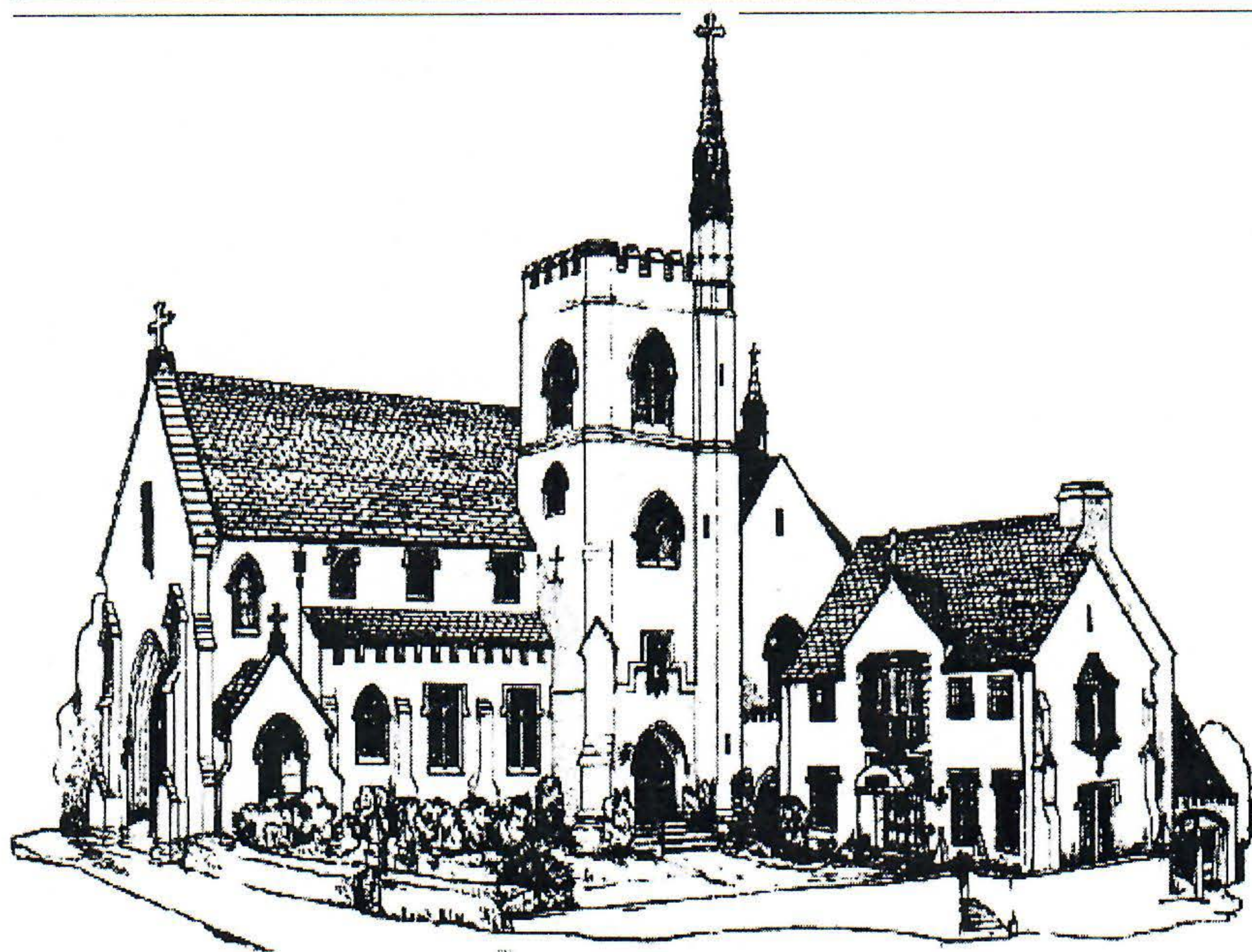

INTROIT Psalm 53. 6-7

ECCE Deus áduvat me, et Dóminus suscēptor est ánimæ meæ: avérte mala inimicis meis, et in veritatē tua dispérde illos, protēctor meus, Dómine. Ps. 53. 3. Deus, in nómine tuo salvum me fac: et in virtutē tua libera me. V. Gloria Patri.

Behold, God is my helper, and the Lord is the protector of my soul: turn back the evils upon mine enemies, and cut them off in Thy truth, O Lord my protector. Ps. Save me, O God, by Thy name, and deliver me in Thy strength. V. Glory be to the Father.

Neque idolólatræ efficiámini, sicut quidam ex ipsis: quemadmodum scriptum est: Sedit pópulus manducáre et bibere, et surrexerunt lúdere. Neque fornicémur, sicut quidam ex ipsis fornicáti sunt, et ceciderunt unadie viginti tria millia. Neque tentémus Christum, sicut quidam eórum tentavérunt, et a serpéntibus perierunt. Neque murmuravérunt, sicut quidam eórum murmuravérunt, et perierunt ab exterminatóre. Hæc autem ómnia in figúra contingébant illis: scripta sunt autem ad correptionem nostram, in quos fines sæculórum devenérunt. Itaque qui se existimat stare, videat ne cadat. Brethren, let us not covet evil things, as they also coveted. Neither become ye idolaters, as some of them: as it is written: The people sat down to eat and drink, and rose up to play. Neither let us commit fornication, as some of them committed fornication, and there fell in one day three and twenty thousand. Neither let us tempt Christ, as some of them tempted, and perished by the serpents. Neither do you murmur, as some of them murmured, and were destroyed by the destroyer. Now all these things happened to them in figure, and they are written for our correction, upon whom the ends of the world are come. Wherefore he that thinketh himself to stand, let him take heed lest he fall. Let no temptation take hold on you, but such as is human: and God is faithful, who will not suffer you to be tempted above that which you are able; but will make also with temptation issue, that you may be able to bear it.

Quia vénient dies in te: et circúmdabunt te inimici tui vallo, et circúmdabunt te: et coangustábunt te úndique: et ad terram prostérnent te, et filios tuos, qui in te sunt, et non relínquent in te lápidem super lápidem: eo quod non cognóveris tempus visitatiónis tuæ. Et ingréssus in templum, cœpit ejicere vendētes in illo et emētes, dicens illis: Scriptum est: Quia domus mea domus oratiónis est. Vos autem fecistis illam spelúncam latrónum. Et erat docens quotidie in templo.

At that time, when Jesus drew near to Jerusalem, seeing the city, He wept over it saying: If thou also hadst known, and that in this day, the things that are to thy peace: but now they are hidden from thy eyes. For the days shall come upon thee, and thy enemies shall cast a trench about thee, and compass thee round, and straiten thee on every side; and beat thee flat to the ground, and thy children who are in thee; and they shall not leave in thee a stone upon a stone, because thou hast not known the time of thy visitation. And entering into the temple, He began to cast out them that sold therein, and them that bought, saying to them: It is written, My house is the house of prayer, but you have made it a den of thieves. And He was teaching daily in the temple.

OFFERTORY Psalm 18. 9-12

IUSTÍTIÆ Dómini rectæ, lætificántes corda, et iudicia ejus dulcióra super mel et favum: nam et servus tuus custódit ea.

The justices of the Lord are right, rejoicing hearts, and His judgments sweeter than honey and the honeycomb: for thy servant keepeth them.

PREFACE OF THE MOST HOLY TRINITY

VERE dignum et justum est, æquum et salutäre, nos tibi semper et ubique grätias ägere, Dömine sancte, Pater omnöpötens, ætérne Deus: Qui cum unigénito Filio tuo, et Spirítu Sancto, unus es Deus, unus es Dóminus: non in unius singularitäre persónæ, sed in unius Trinitäre substántiæ. Quod enim de tua glória, revelánte te, crédimus, hoc de Filio tuo, hoc de Spirítu Sancto, sine différentia discretiónis sentímus. Ut in confessióne veræ, sempiternæque Deitátis, et in persónis proprietas et in esséntia únitás, et in majestäte adorétur æquálitas. Quam laudant Angeli, atque Archángeli, Chérubim quoque ac Séraphim: qui non cessant clamäre quotidie, una voce dicéntes:

It is truly meet and just, right and for our salvation, that we should at all times, and in all places, give thanks to Thee, holy Lord, Father almighty, eternal God: Who, together with Thine only-begotten Son and the Holy Ghost, art one God, one Lord: not in the Oneness of a single Person, but in the Trinity of one substance. For what by Thy revelation we believe of Thy glory, the same do we believe of Thy Son, the same of the Holy Ghost, without difference or separation; so that in confessing the true and eternal Godhead, in It we should adore distinction in persons, unity in Essence, and equality in Majesty: in praise of which Angels and Archangels, Cherubim also and Seraphim day and night exclaim, without end and with one voice saying:

QUI mandúcat meam carnem et bibit meum ságuinem, in me manet et ego in eo, dicit Dóminus.

COMMUNION John 6. 57

He that eateth My Flesh, and drinketh My Blood, abideth in Me, and I in him, saith the Lord.

POSTCOMMUNION

TUI nobis, quæsumus, Dómine, commúnio sacraménti, et purificatióne cónferat, ettribuat unitátem. Per Dóminum

May our reception of Thy holy Sacrament, O Lord, both purify us from sin and grant us unity in Thy service. Through our Lord.

How beautiful is the face of Jesus transfigured on Mount Tabor [cf. Mt. 17:2] and how beautiful it is to keep Him company on that mount of glory! There we must center our desires and our affections, not in this land of miseries, where we can find only vain beauty of beautiful vanity! By the grace of our Savior, however, we are climbing Tabor, because we have made stable and firm resolutions to love deeply and to serve the Divine Goodness. But we must encourage ourselves with holy hope and climb without getting tired, until we have that heavenly vision of God. So let us detach ourselves, little by little, from base and earthly affections, and look forward to the heavenly happiness that awaits us.
