

PREFACE OF THE MOST HOLY TRINITY

VERE dignum et justum est, æquum et salutare, nos tibi semper, et ubique gratias agere: Domine sancta, Pater omnipotens, æterne Deus. Qui cum unigenito Filio: tuo et Spiritu Sancto, unus es Deus, unus es Dominus: non in uninus singularitate personé, sed in unius Trinité substantié. Quo denim de tua Gloria, revelante te, credimus, hoc de Filio tuo, hod de Spiritu Sancto, sine differentia discretionis sentimus. Ut in confessione verare, sempitiernæque Deitatis, et in personis proprietas, et in essential unitas, et in majestate adoretur æ-qualitas. Quam laudant Angeli atque Archangeli, Cherubim, quoque ac Seraphim: qui non cessant clamare quotodie, una voce dicentes:

It is truly meet and just, right and for our salvation, that we should at all times and in all places, give thanks unto Thee, O holy Lord, Father almighty, everlasting God: Who, together with Thine only-begotten Son, and the Holy Ghost, are one God, one Lord: not in the oneness of a single Person, but in the Trinity of one substance. For what we believe by Thy revelation of Thy glory, the same do we believe of Thy Son, the same of the Holy Ghost, without difference or separation. So that in confessing the true and everlasting Godhead, distinction in persons, unity in essence, and equality in majesty may be adored. Which the Angels and Archangels, the Cherubim also and Seraphim do praise: who cease not daily to cry out with one voice saying:

TÓLLITE hóstias, et introíte in átria ejus: adoráte Dóminum in aula sancta ejus.

Bring up sacrifices, and come into His courts: adore ye the Lord in His holy court.

POSTCOMMUNION

GRÁTIAS tibi reférimus, Dómine, sacro múnere vegetáti, tuam misericórdiam deprecántes: ut dignos nos ejus participatióne perfícias. Per Dominum nostrum Jesum Christum.

We who are fed with Thy holy Gift, O Lord, do offer our thanks unto Thee: beseeching Thy mercy that Thou mayest make us worthy to share in it. Through the same Lord Jesus Christ.

Wisdom from our patron, Saint Francis de Sales:

Know that the virtue of patience is the one that more than any other insures our perfection. We should practice it with our neighbor, but we should practice it still more with ourselves. Those who aspire to pure love of God have not as much need to practice patience with others as with themselves. To acquire perfection, one must not look for temptations but simply tolerate them with patience; humility is reinforced with this tolerance. We must face the truth: we are poor people who cannot do much good, but God, Who is infinitely good, is quite happy with the little good that we do.

RCIA Classes are beginning now...

For people who are interested in learning more about the Catholic faith, and who want to receive the sacraments of Baptism, First Holy Communion, and/or Confirmation. Classes are conducted by Steve Cortright, a philosophy professor at St Mary's College with a *mandatum* (a bishop's clearance) to teach Catholic theology.

The RCIA classes meet in the parish rectory office Sunday mornings from 9:30 until 10:20. People who wish to do so may receive the sacraments and/or be received into the Catholic Church at Easter. The RCIA textbook is the Cathecism of the Catholic Church, 2nd Edition, which may be purchased as a paperback from Amazon or at a local bookstore, and is also available online.
