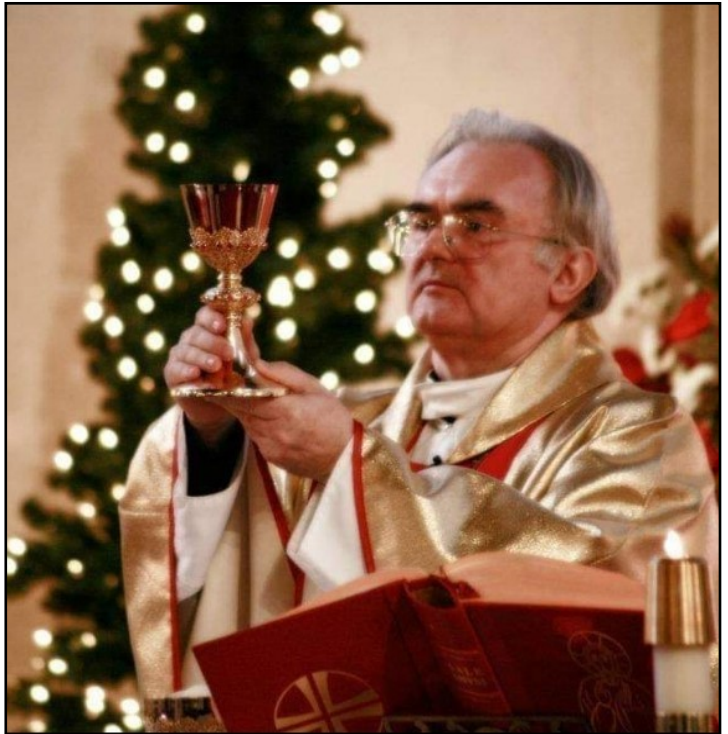

It is truly meet and just, right and for our salvation, that we should at all times and in all places, give thanks unto Thee, O holy Lord, Father almighty, everlasting God: Who, together with Thine only-begotten Son, and the Holy Ghost, are one God, one Lord: not in the oneness of a single Person, but in the Trinity of one substance. Feast of St. Francis de Sales

St. Francis de Sales (1567-1622, canonized in 1665 by Pope Alexander VII) is a principal patron saint of the Institute of Christ the King Sovereign Priest. On this patronal feast day, all the faithful who devoutly assist at Holy Mass at an Institute apostolate have an opportunity to gain a plenary indulgence, under the usual conditions: Holy Communion, sacramental Confession, prayer for the intentions of the Holy Father, and detachment from all sins. Coincidentally, St. Francis de Sales is also a co-patron of the Oakland Diocese.
