Want to serve our priests? month the Parish hosts a morning of recollection for priests of our diocese from 10:30am until Noon on the third Friday of each month from September - May. The Parish has hosted these mornings of recollection as well as a luncheon for priests for many years. The priests listen to a spiritual talk, have opportunity for Confession, and Benediction in the Church. When they are done, they go to Fr. Kozina hall for lunch.

There are usually 4-6 priests. A simple meatless meal can be prepared in the hall's kitchen or at home and brought in and served. Two people per Friday are needed to do this. You are not expected to entertain or mingle, just set up, have the meal ready at noon, serve it, and clean up when they are done—usually by 1 pm.

## **Excerpt from *The Mystery of the Eucharist*** **In The Life Of The Church**

39. The Second Vatican Council stresses the importance of reverence toward the human person. "Everyone must consider his every neighbor without exception as another self, taking into account first of all his life and the means necessary to living it with dignity, so as not to imitate the rich man who had no concern for the poor man Lazarus" (Second Vatican Council, *Gaudium et Spes*, no. 27). The Council goes on to say that whatever is opposed to life itself, such as any type of murder, genocide, abortion, euthanasia or willful self-destruction, whatever violates the integrity of the human person, such as mutilation, torments inflicted on body or mind, attempts to coerce the will itself; whatever insults human dignity, such as subhuman living conditions, arbitrary imprisonment, deportation, slavery, prostitution, the selling of women and children; as well as disgraceful working conditions, where men are treated as mere tools for profit, rather than as free and responsible persons; all these things and others of their like are infamies indeed. They poison human society, but they do more harm to those who practice them than those who suffer from the injury (Second Vatican Council, *Gaudium et Spes*, no. 27).

40. Just as we are impelled by the Eucharist to hear the cry of the poor, and respond in love, we are also called to hear the cry of the earth and, likewise, respond with loving care (Pope Francis, *Laudato Si'*, no. 49). Pope Francis, like Pope Benedict XVI before him, has eloquently drawn the connection between the celebration of the Eucharist and care for the environment (Pope Francis, *Laudato Si'*, no. 236; Pope Benedict XVI, *Sacramentum Caritatis*, no. 92). All creation gives glory to God, and journeys toward divinization, toward union with the Creator.

41. We look forward to the day when all such evils will be eliminated, when the Kingdom of God is established in its fullness. Then, there will be a new heaven and a new earth, and the human community will dwell in a new Jerusalem, in which God himself will dwell with his people (Rev 21:1-3). No one will suffer from poverty or injustice or violence. We will be able to see each other as God sees us, without any of the distortions caused by sin or by structures of sin such as racism or the various manifestations of the throwaway culture. No one will be seen as "disposable." We will be able to love each other in a way that reflects the way God loves us.

Brethren: To me, the least of all the Saints, is given the grace, to preach among the Gentiles the unsearchable riches of Christ: and to enlighten all men, that they may see what is the dispensation of the mystery which hath been hidden from eternity in God, Who created all things: For this cause I bow my knees to the Father of our Lord Jesus Christ, of Whom all paternity in heaven and earth is named, that He would grant you according to the riches of His glory, to be strengthened by His Spirit with might unto the inward man, that Christ may dwell by faith in your hearts: that being rooted and grounded in charity, you may be able to comprehend with all the Saints, what is the breadth and length, and height and depth: to know also the charity of Christ which surpasseth all knowledge. That you may be filled unto all the fullness of God.
