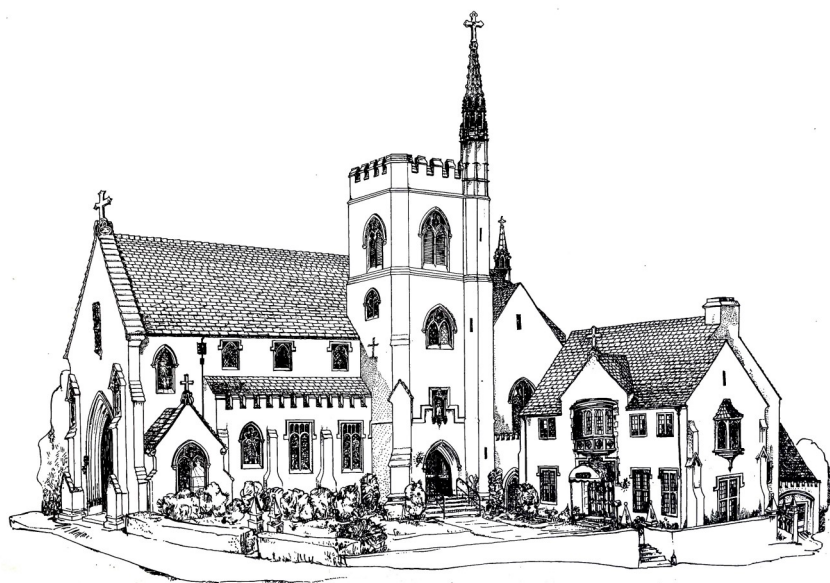

Excerpt from *The Mystery of the Eucharist* **In The Life Of The Church**

44. Christ began his public ministry by calling people to repentance and conversion: Repent, and believe in the gospel (Mk 1:15; cf. Mt 4:17). It is thus fitting that, at the beginning of every Mass, we are invited to acknowledge our sins in order to prepare ourselves to celebrate the sacred mysteries. We confess that we have sinned, and we implore the Lord's mercy. This is necessary since we are all sinners and sometimes fail to live up to our vocation as disciples of Jesus and to the promises of our Baptism. We need continually to heed Christ's call to conversion. We trust in his mercy, the mercy that we behold in his body broken for us and his blood poured out for us for the forgiveness of our sins. We are to approach the Lord with humble and contrite hearts and to say with sincerity: “Lord, I am not worthy that you should enter under my roof, but only say the word and my soul shall be healed.”

45. While all our failures to do what is right damage our communion with God and with each other, they fall into different categories, reflecting different degrees of severity. This brings us to the distinction between venial and mortal sins. Venial sins are those sins and everyday faults that, although they reflect a degree of selfishness, do not break the covenant with God. They do not deprive the sinner of friendship with God or of sanctifying grace (See *Catechism of the Catholic Church*, no. 1863). Venial sins are not to be taken lightly, but they do not destroy communion because they do not destroy the principle of divine life in us. Indeed, reception of the Eucharist strengthens our charity and wipes away venial sins, while also helping us to avoid more serious sins (*Catechism of the Catholic Church*, nos. 1394 and 1395, citing Council of Trent: The Eucharist “is a remedy to free us from our daily faults and to preserve us from mortal sin,” Session 13, *Decree on the Sacrament of the Eucharist*, ch. 2). Pope Francis brought attention to this medicinal character of the Eucharist when he pointed out that it “is not a prize for the perfect but a powerful medicine and nourishment for the weak” (Pope Francis, *Evangelii Gaudium*, no. 47). He also warns us against the Pelagian error of forgetting our constant need for grace and thinking that living a holy life depends on our own force of will (Pope Francis, *Gaudete et Exsultate*, nos. 48-62).

Happy Feast Day!

Quas primas was an encyclical of Pope Pius XI. Promulgated on December 11, 1925, it introduced the Feast of Christ the King.

Traditionally, the Sunday preceding the Feast of All Saints is the feast of the Kingship of Our Lord Jesus Christ.

As this is the titular feast of the Institute of Christ the King Sovereign Priest, a **plenary indulgence** is available to all faithful who devoutly assist at Masses today at all Institute churches and apostolates, under the usual conditions.

INTROIT Apocalypse 5. 12, 1-6

DIGNUS est Agnus, qui occisus est, accipere virtutem, et divinitatem et sapientiam, et fortitudinem, et honorem. Ipsi gloria et imperium in saecula saeculorum. Ps. 71: 1. Deus, iudicium tuum Regi da: et iustitiam tuam Filio Regis. v. Gloria Patri.

The Lamb that was slain is worthy to receive the power and divinity and wisdom and strength and honour: to Him be glory and empire for ever and ever. Ps. Give to the King, O God, Thy judgment, and to the King's Son Thy justice. V. Glory be to the Father.

Brethren: We give thanks to God, the Father, Who hath made us worthy to be partakers of the lot of the saints in light: Who hath delivered us from the power of darkness, and hath translated us into the kingdom of the Son of His love. In Whom we have redemption through His blood, the remission of sins; Who is the image of the invisible God, the firstborn of every creature for in Him were all things created in Heaven and on earth visible and invisible, whether thrones, or dominations, or principalities, or powers: all things were created by Him and in Him. And He is before all, and by Him all things consist. And He is the head of the body of the Church, Who is the beginning, the firstborn from the dead; that in all things He may hold the primacy: because in Him it hath well pleased the Father that all fullness should dwell; and through Him to reconcile all things unto Himself, making peace through the Blood of His Cross, both as to the things that are on earth, and the things that are in Heaven, in Christ Jesus Our Lord.

If My kingdom were of this world, My servants would certainly strive that I should not be delivered to the Jews: but now My kingdom is not from hence. Pilate therefore said to him: Art thou a king then? Jesus answered: Thou sayest that I am a King. For this was I born, and for I this came I into the world; that I should give testimony to the truth, Every-one that is of the truth, heareth My voice.
