

Excerpt from The Mystery of the Eucharist In The Life Of The Church

49. One's communion with Christ and His Church, therefore, involves both one's "invisible communion" (being in the state of grace) and one's "visible communion." St. John Paul II explained:

The judgment of one's state of grace obvious ly belongs only to the person involved, since it is a question of examining one's conscience. However, in cases of outward con duct which is seriously, clearly and steadfastly contrary to the moral norm, the Church, in her pastoral concern for the good order of the community and out of respect for the sacra ment, cannot fail to feel directly involved. The Code of Canon Law refers to this situation of a manifest lack of proper moral disposition when it states that those who 'obstinately per sist in manifest grave sin' are not to be admitted to Eucharistic communion" (Pope John Paul II, Ecclesia de Eucharistia, no. 37; see Code of Canon Law, can. 915: "Those who have been excommunicated or interdicted after the imposition or declaration of the penalty and others obstinately persevering in manifest grave sin are not to be admitted to Holy Communion." Likewise, the Code of Canons of the Eastern Churches states that "those who are public ly unworthy are forbidden from receiving the Divine Eu charist" [c. 712]).

It is the special responsibility of the diocesan bishop to work to remedy situations that involve public actions at variance with the visible communion of the Church and the moral law. Indeed, he must guard the integrity of the sacrament, the visible communion of the Church, and the salvation of souls.

50. Before we receive Holy Communion, we should make a good examination of conscience to ensure that we are properly disposed to receive the Body and Blood of the Lord (For the Church's teaching on conscience, see Second Vatican Council, Gaudium et Spes, no. 16; Catechism of the Catholic Church, nos. 1776-1802, Pope John Paul II, Veritatis Splendor, nos. 31-34 and 54-64). If we find that we have broken communion with Christ and his Church, we are not properly disposed to receive the Eucharist. On the first Easter night, the Risen Jesus gave to the Apostles and their successors the power to forgive sins and to reconcile sinners with the Church....
