

Have you offered a Mass Intention lately? The Mass is offered not only for the general intention for the Church, for the ministers and assembly present, but also for a specific intention. The faithful may ask for a regularly scheduled Mass in the Parish to be offered for their particular, personal intention. It can be for themselves, or for their loved ones both living or deceased. The Sacrifice of the Mass is the highest form of prayer in the Church and is the propitiatory Sacrifice of Our Lord, and therefore has the power to atone for sins. Historically, Mass Intentions have been offered for the response of the soul of our beloved dead.

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Intentions are assigned to Masses on a "first come, first served" basis. If the date you requested is already taken, we will assign your Intention to the closest Mass that is still open for Intentions. If you have no particular date in mind, that's also acceptable. The Office will assign your Intention to an available Mass. Because we have many requests for Intentions at the 12:30pm Mass on Sundays, the Office may limit the Intentions assigned to this Mass to two Intentions per individual/family per year.

We can only assign Masses to dates four months ahead and not beyond.

Excerpt from The Body-Soul Unity of the Human Person

From the beginning of his or her existence, the human person has a body that is sexually differentiated as male or female (While there are a small percentage of individuals affected by disorders of sexual development or sexual ambiguity, their biological sex may be identifiable through genetic techniques or other medical means, albeit with some difficulty). "Being man' or 'being woman' is a reality which is good and willed by God" (Catechism of the Catholic Church, 369). Consequently, one can never be said to be in the "wrong" body (Committee on Doctrine, Doctrinal Note, 4). "For this reason," the Catechism of the Catholic Church explains, "man may not despise his bodily life. Rather, he is obliged to regard his body as good and to hold it in honor since God has created it and will raise it up on the last day" (Gaudium et Spes, 14 [1965]. Ouoted in Catechism of the Catholic Church, 364). Male-female sexual difference and complementarity are also essential to a Christian understanding of marital conjugal union, which is itself an image of Trinitarian communion. Eliminating this difference would diminish in man and woman part of what it means to bear God's image and likeness. In addition, it would do away with the very basis of the family, the "first vital cell of society" (Pontifical Council for Justice and Peace, Compendium of the Social Doctrine of the Church, 211 [2004]). Doing so would be an offense against human dignity and a social injustice.

Many faithful Catholics demonstrate solidarity with those suffering from gender dysphoria, unjust discrimination, or other questions related to gender identity and sincerely desire to respond in love to their sisters and brothers. The Church is called to do as Jesus did, to accompany in a spirit of solidarity those marginalized and suffering while affirming the beauty and truth of God's creation. "Truth is the light that gives meaning and value to charity.... Without truth, charity degenerates into sentimentality. Love becomes an empty shell" (Pope Benedict XVI, Encyclical Caritas in Veritate, 3). Compassion that does not include both truth and charity is a misplaced compassion. Support for those experiencing gender dysphoria must be characterized by an active concern for genuine Christian charity and the truth about the human person. It is, in fact, the truth about the dignity of each person which demands that no one should suffer bullying, violence, insults, or unjust discrimination (Male and Female He Created Them, [2019] 16).
