## **ANNOUNCEMENTS:**

This year's annual **40-Hour Devotion Adoration** at St. Margaret Mary begins at 6pm on February 29th and ends at 10am on March 2nd (First Saturday). Please sign-up. A sign-up sheet is available in the vestibule. Please let us know if you intend to be with Our Lord in prayer.

Confessions will be heard on Thursday evening beginning at 6:30pm until 8:30pm.

The 40-hour Devotion or *Quarant'Ore* is a special forty-hour period of continuous prayer made before the Blessed Sacrament in solemn exposition. The Blessed Sacrament remains in a monstrance on the altar for forty hours while the faithful gather for personal or public prayer in adoration of our Lord.

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Attention **Young Adults**: A special solemn candlelight Mass will be offered by Bishop Michael Barber at St. Margaret Mary's on March 2nd (Saturday) at 7am. The Mass will be offered in Latin in the Ordinary Form.

A reception follows in the Hall. This event is sponsored by the **Bay Wide Young Adults** which aims to provide fellowship opportunities for Catholic young adults across the Bay Area, to support young adult communities at Bay Area parishes, and to put on young adult events that are generally too complicated or too expensive for a single parish to do alone. Please join us.

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Lenten Regulations: Ash Wednesday and Good Friday are obligatory days of universal fast and abstinence. Fasting is obligatory for all who have completed their 18th year until the beginning of their 60th year. Fasting allows a person to eat one full meal. Two smaller meals may be taken, not to equal one full meal. Abstinence (from meat) is obligatory for all who have completed their 14th year of age. If possible, the fast on Good Friday is continued until the Easter Vigil (on Holy Saturday night) as the "paschal fast" to honor the suffering and death of the Lord Jesus and to prepare to share more fully and celebrate more readily his Resurrection.

Fridays in Lent are obligatory days of abstinence (from meat) for all who have completed their 14th year. As always, anyone for whom fasting or abstinence would pose a health risk is excused.

## **From a sermon by Saint Gregory of Nazianzen, bishop**

Recognize to whom you owe the fact that you exist, that you breathe, that you understand, that you are wise, and, above all, that you know God and hope for the kingdom of heaven and the vision of glory, now darkly as in a mirror but then with greater fullness and purity. You have been made a son of God, co-heir with Christ. Where did you get all this, and from whom?

Let me turn to what is of less importance: the visible world around us. What benefactor has enabled you to look out upon the beauty of the sky, the sun in its course, the circle of the moon, the countless number of stars, with the harmony and order that are theirs, like the music of a harp? Who has blessed you with rain, with the art of husbandry, with different kinds of food, with the arts, with houses, with laws, with states, with a life of humanity and culture, with friendship and the easy familiarity of kinship?

Who has given you dominion over animals, those that are tame and those that provide you with food? Who has made you lord and master of everything on earth? In short, who has endowed you with all that makes man superior to all other living creatures?

Is it not God who asks you now in your turn to show yourself generous above all other creatures and for the sake of all other creatures? Because we have received from him so many wonderful gifts, will we not be ashamed to refuse him this one thing only, our generosity? Though he is God and Lord he is not afraid to be known as our Father. Shall we for our part repudiate those who are our kith and kin?

Brethren and friends, let us never allow ourselves to misuse what has been given us by God's gift. If we do, we shall hear Saint Peter say: *Be ashamed of yourselves for holding on to what belongs to someone else. Resolve to imitate God's justice, and no one will be poor.* Let us not labor to heap up and hoard riches while others remain in need. If we do, the prophet Amos will speak out against us with sharp and threatening words: *Come now, you that say: When will the new moon be over, so that we may start selling? When will the sabbath be over, so that we may start opening our treasures?*

Let us put into practice the supreme and primary law of God. He sends down rain on just and sinful alike, and causes the sun to rise on all without distinction. To all earth's creatures he has given the broad earth, the springs, the rivers and the forests. He has given the air to the birds, and the waters to those who live in the water.
