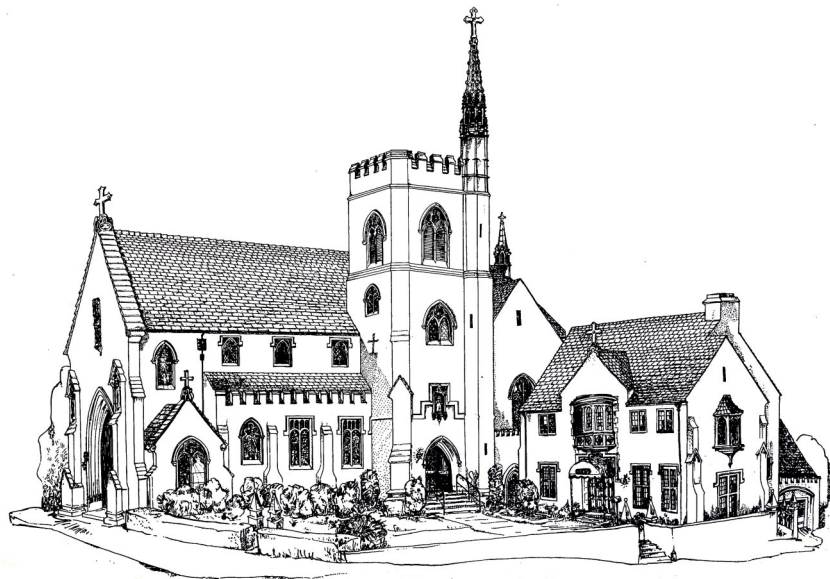

Have you offered a Mass Intention lately? The Mass is offered not only for the general intention for the Church, for the ministers and assembly present, but also for a specific intention. The faithful may ask for a regularly scheduled Mass in the Parish to be offered for their particular, personal intention. It can be for themselves, or for their loved ones both living or deceased. The Sacrifice of the Mass is the highest form of prayer in the Church and is the propitiatory Sacrifice of Our Lord, and therefore has the power to atone for sins. Historically, Mass Intentions have been offered for the response of the soul of our beloved dead.

If you would like to offer a Mass Intention, drop the Mass Intention envelope in the Parish mailbox; or send us an email; or leave a message in the Parish voicemail.

Intentions are assigned to Masses on a "first come, first served" basis. If the date you requested is already taken, we will assign your Intention to the closest Mass that is still open for Intentions. If you have no particular date in mind, that's also acceptable: the Office will assign your Intention to an available Mass.

We can only assign Masses to dates four months ahead and not beyond.

Except from the Encyclical *Dilexit nos*: On the Human & Divine Love of Our Lord Jesus Christ

28. It is only by starting from the heart that our communities will succeed in uniting and reconciling differing minds and wills, so that the Spirit can guide us in unity as brothers and sisters. Reconciliation and peace are also born of the heart. The heart of Christ is “ecstasy”, openness, gift and encounter. In that heart, we learn to relate to one another in wholesome and happy ways, and to build up in this world God’s kingdom of love and justice. Our hearts, united with the heart of Christ, are capable of working this social miracle.

29. Taking the heart seriously, then, has consequences for society as a whole. The Second Vatican Council teaches that, “every one of us needs a change of heart; we must set our gaze on the whole world and look to those tasks we can all perform together in order to bring about the betterment of our race”. [Pastoral Constitution *Gaudium et Spes*, 82] For “the imbalances affecting the world today are in fact a symptom of a deeper imbalance rooted in the human heart”. [Ibid.,10] In pondering the tragedies afflicting our world, the Council urges us to return to the heart. It explains that human beings “by their interior life, transcend the entire material universe; they experience this deep interiority when they enter into their own heart, where God, who probes the heart, awaits them, and where they decide their own destiny in the sight of God”. [Ibid.,14]

30. This in no way implies an undue reliance on our own abilities. Let us never forget that our hearts are not self-sufficient, but frail and wounded. They possess an ontological dignity, yet at the same time must seek an ever more dignified life. [Dicastery For The Doctrine Of The Faith, Declaration *Dignitas Infinita* (2 April 2024), 8. Cf. *L’Osservatore Romano*, 8 April 2024] The Second Vatican Council points out that “the ferment of the Gospel has aroused and continues to arouse in human hearts an unquenchable thirst for human dignity”. [Pastoral Constitution *Gaudium et Spes*, 26] Yet to live in accordance with this dignity, it is not enough to know the Gospel or to carry out mechanically its demands. We need the help of God’s love. Let us turn, then, to the heart of Christ, that core of his being, which is a blazing furnace of divine and human love and the most sublime fulfilment to which humanity can aspire. There, in that heart, we truly come at last to know ourselves and we learn how to love.
